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1. Sixth Transnational Meeting

The sixth Transnational Meeting took place in HMCOLLEGE in Rotterdam. The meeting was held on the 10th – 11th May 2017

During the first day, each partner showed its Training Module with training units to check the contents and to analyse the level of each training unit, to understand better the defined content.

One important issue is the relationship between the defined modules, and that there are no duplications in the content of each training module and unit.

Taking into account that the carpentry qualification carries a very experimental part, and considering that the material that has been prepared is online, we made great emphasis on the need to put videos and material that facilitates the learning about the machines and installation systems.



To avoid copyright problems, many of the partners are developing their own videos.

In the case that the videos are not owned by partners, we have agreed to use video demonstration of manufacturers who will be asked for permission or public videos on YouTube.

2. Training Modules

Each partner has developed its training module with its corresponding training units.

TRAINING MODULE 1: "Preparation and planning"

- Training Unit 1: Knowledge on wooden material
- Training Unit 2: Making design drawings
- Training Unit 3: Making preparations and calculations according to plan and technical specifications
- Training Unit 4: Specifying the method of material connection

TRAINING MODULE 2: "Selection (materials and machines)"

- Training Unit 1: Set-up industrial wood processing machines
- Training Unit 2 : Set-up CNC wood processing machines

TRAINING MODULE 3: "Processing"

- Training Unit 1: Operating with hand tools
- Training Unit 2: Operating electric hand-operated machines
- Training Unit 3: Operating with woodworking machines
- Training Unit 4: Operating with automated and computerized machines



TRAINING MODULE 5: "Finishing joinery"

- Training Unit 1: Prepare surfaces for finishing (sanding, de-dusting, polishing...)
- Training unit 2: Manual treatment of surface

TRAINING MODULE 6: "Installing joinery on-site"

- Training unit 1: Inspection of work place
- Training unit 2: Preparing on-site
- Training unit 3: Preparation and supervision of materials.
- Training unit 4: Fitting of elements.
- Training unit 5: Installation of all elements.
- Training Unit 6: Fitting of shelf units and iron fittings
- Training Unit 7: Repainting and adjusting joinery elements.
- Training Unit 8: Quality and control.

TRAINING MODULE 7: "Completing work assignment"

- Training Unit 1: Coordinating work carried out according manufacturing
- Training Unit 2: Perform maintenance of hand tools, conventional matching and daily report of manufacturing orders.
- Training Unit 3: Control the quality at workplace and finished product and eliminate waste
- Training Unit 4: Stock, packaging and transport
